- 1. Bridging Exemption Test (BET) is a module test, constructed based on the content lectures of Bridging Programme. Students are required to sit for the test module according to the bachelor's degree programme that UTM has offered as stated in Table 1.
- 2. There will be two (2) sessions available for the test. Candidates can choose to register for any of the sessions.
- 3. The passing mark is 65 out of 100 for each module. This means that candidates must achieve a minimum score of 65% for all modules. If candidates pass all the modules, they are allowed to skip the Bridging Programme and enroll into their bachelor's degree programme at their respective faculty.
- 4. If candidates do not meet the minimum score in the first session, they are allowed to re-sit for the failed module/s in the second session.
- 5. Candidates who choose to register in the second session and does not meet the minimum score are not allowed to re-sit for the test. Candidates must proceed to Bridging programme.

However, the answer schemes are not provided. It is recommended that candidates try to do the sample questions before deciding whether they want to register for BET or not.
